118During the open discussion BR under item #5 of the disapproved BRs, has a valid and acceptable119reason for disapproval. People from the floor raised that if the loanable amount for a collateral120loan is increased from 50% up to 70% to a maximum of 80%, therefore the borrower will lose121interest in redeeming his collateralized property.122

Whereupon, upon motion made by CH Eduardo Santos and duly seconded by AC Ruth Salhay,
Board Resolutions abovementioned in items 1 to 3, and upon the motion made by CH Leonora
San Juan and duly seconded by CH Maxima Salhay Board Resolution listed in item 4, while upon

Resolution under item 5 were DISAPPROVED by the general membership.

132 Moreover, according to CH Antonio Juliano Board Resolution No. 2022-24 also known as 133 Litigation Expenses should not be made as Board Resolution which was officially agreed by CH 134 Maxima Salhay. Trustee Virginia Saclot BOT Treasurer explained further that their intention in 135 the inclusion of the said Board Resolution as part of the BRs for approval of the general 136 membership is to safeguard the interest of the four (4) elected BOTs last year. Lastly Trustee 137 Virginia Saclot, also added that they have no intention to strike it out but rather to complete the 138 statement stated therein.

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141 IX. **Guidelines for 2023 Election of Trustees**

142 Trustee Emilia Pasco, Chairman of Nomination Committee, explained the mechanics for this 143 year's election of the members of the Board of Trustees. This year PF has three (3) outgoing 144 trustees, that pave the way to have 3 vacant seats for BOT and have to be filled up through the 145 election of the general membership.

- 153 BOT Auditor Virginia Saclot presented the 2022 Statement of Comprehensive Income and 154 Statement of Financial Position duly audited by AMC and Associates, the accredited External 155 Auditor of the Association. The company's Net Income for 2022 amounted to ₱ 48,350,197. 156 (For other details, please refer to copy of the report.) 157
- 158 Meanwhile, the company's Total Assets amounted to ₱ 1,153,115,718 and Total Liabilities 159 accounted for **P** 748,497,440 while Fund Balance amounted to **P404,618,278**. (For other details, 160 please refer to copy of the report.)
- 161 XI. **Report from the President**
- 162 President Gener Luciano reported the highlights of the Association's performance in 2021. 163
 - The President also reported that the Articles of Incorporation is subject for amendment for the purpose of tax revalidation and must include the following:
 - 1. It is a non-stock non-profit corporation or association;
 - 2. No part of the corporation or association's net income shall insure to the benefit of any private individual;
- 169 3. The trustees of the non-profit corporation or association do not receive any compensation 170 or remuneration: and
- 171 4. In case of dissolution, its assets shall be distributed to one or more entities formed for the 172 purpose/purposes similar to its own, or to the Philippine government for public purpose.

Finally, President Luciano also announced that for the year 2022, the rate of dividends to be tagged as earnings for planholders shall be 8.5% and 6% for participating and non-participating members, respectively.

177 XII. Result of 2023 Election

178Ms. Reina Asuncion Pedroche, Independent Scrutineer, certified that the votes were tabulated in179the presence of designated watchers to ensure the integrity of the electoral process. She presented180the final and official tally of votes, and proclaimed the three (3) winning candidates. For this181year's winners, they will all have a three (3) year term as Trustee.
